Mr. Charlie C. Silcox, age 78, of 514 Bland St. Richlands, Virginia died Monday, September 22nd, 2003 at a Richlands, Virginia hospital following a lengthy illness. He was born in Dickenson County, Virginia and was a son of the late James Enock and Dora Austin Silcox, both Dickenson County natives. He made his home in War, West Virginia most of his life, living in Richlands over thirty years and was a retired contractor, electrician, and carpenter. He was a World War II U. S. Army Veteran serving in Italy, France, Germany, Belgium and awarded two bronze stars, a combat infantry badge, and numerous citations.
