Courtney Cox Bowen, MD, age 86, of Richlands, Virginia, passed away Wednesday, December 13, 2006 at a Richlands, Virginia hospital. He was born in the Cove area of Tazewell, Virginia and was the son of the late William Rees and Frances Barns Bowen. He had made his home in the Richlands, Virginia area most of his life where he practiced medicine for over 37 years. He was a graduate of Tazewell High School and received his Bachelor of Science degree in Business from the University of Richmond and graduated from the Medical College of Virginia. He was a U.S. Army World War II Veteran having served as an Administrator of a MASH Unit for the U.S. Army Air Corps. He was a member of the First United Methodist Church in Richlands, Virginia. In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by three sisters and three brothers. He was the last surviving member of his immediate family.
