Glanis O. Thompson, age 95 of Weber City, VA, formerly of the Frog Level community of Tazewell Co., VA, died Saturday, June 23, 2012 at a Weber City, VA health care facility. She was born October 3, 1916 in McCreary Co., KY and was a daughter of the late Pete and Anna Cox Lewis.
