Mr. Harlis Reed Horn, age 67, of Wilkesboro, died Tuesday, July 22, 2014 at his home.

Harlis had a passion for restoring vintage bicycles and took great pride and

detail in his work. He restored and sold many bicycles throughout the United States and has one on display in the Audie L. Murphy Museum in Greenville, TX

Harlis was an avid bass fisherman all his life. He was awarded his Master Angler in 1977. He was a member of the Wilkes County Bass Masters Club. He was a winner of many tournaments. His biggest catch was an 8.5 lb large mouth bass.

Harlis loved Gospel, Country and Bluegrass music and played guitar since childhood. He traveled throughout Virginia, North Carolina and Tennessee playing and singing in the band "American Travelers". The band played many venues raising money for Muscular Dystrophy Association and other charities. The band had their first professional music recording at the Easter Brothers Studio in Mt. Airy, NC.

He was a kind and gentle person who loved spending time with family and friends. He was a loving husband, father, brother, papaw and friend. His faith and trust in Jesus Christ was strong all the way to the bitter end. He will be sadly missed by everyone who knew him, but never forgotten.
