Jane Lee Lilly Martin, age 93, was called home to be with her beloved Lord Jesus on Sunday, August 31, 2025, at the Commonwealth Senior Living center in Abingdon, Virginia.

She radiated joy around children and had endless hugs to give. Jane grew up in the depth of the Great Depression on the extended family farm, walking long distances to school. Her intellectual aptitude was noted and she was able to skip the second grade. Though she was only 4'11 1/2 inches tall, she played basketball. She married during her senior year of high school and followed her husband, John to Belleville, Illinois and Bangor, Maine while he served in the United States Air Force. Her first two children were born at Dow Air Force Base, Maine. After returning to Pineville, West Virginia, her third child was born, and there she started raising her children. Moving to Richlands, Virginia, in 1963, she helped with the family budget as a legal secretary. She also bowled in a women's bowling league. She was active in church, singing in the choir, visiting shut-ins, arranging flowers, and participating in outreach and fundraising projects. She volunteered to work in Civic events and even did the "Can-can" in a talent show with a chorus line of women for a charitable cause. Later in her working life, she was employed at Cumberland Mountain Community Service, where she was recognized for her outstanding secretarial work. Jane was one of those notable persons in the ever-changing evolution of human history who brought light and goodness to the world. As she transcends these earthly confines, her love and warm smile
