Juanita Lytton Hamilton, age 97 of Richlands, Virginia, drew her last breath on this earth on Thursday, January 9, 2020 in Grundy, Virginia at Heritage Hall assisted Living.

She was born April 26, 1922 in Coeburn, Virginia and was the daughter of the late Charles P. Lytton and Leona McReynolds Lytton. Juanita was a devoted and loving mother, grandmother, great-grandmother and friend.

Juanita married her love, Bill Hamilton, who was a Navy man. They moved to Maryland where Juanita went to work at the Lockheed-Martin factory as a “Rosie Riveter” during the war. She helped to produce tanks, ships, planes, and other material during World War II. As the song went, “She’s making history, working for victory, Rosie the Riveter.” After the war, they returned to the Bradshaw, West Virginia area and settled down to raise a family. Bill went to work in the mines and Juanita became a devoted homemaker. She enjoyed raising flowers, especially petunias and tulips, and when asked how she grew such beautiful petunias, she replied, “I give them haircuts,” but no one ever knew exactly what that meant. She grew a few vegetables, especially tommy toe tomatoes. She was quite often referred to by her family as the Energizer Bunny, especially when you took her shopping to Lowes, Roses, or her

favorite store, the Dollar Tree. Even as an elderly lady, she would get her buggy and zoom away, leaving her family to try and catch up with her. Juanita was known for being feisty, speaking her mind, and telling it like it was. If your feelings got hurt, oh well, the truth is the truth. She was the last surviving member of her family and had spent most of her life in the surrounding area.

In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by her loving husband, Bill Hamilton; daughter, Brenda Smith; son, Larry Hamilton; sister, Trula Evans; brothers, Ernest Lytton and Cecil Lytton; son-in-law, Dr. E.K. Whitley, Jr.
