Mrs. Judith Ann Casey Jessee, age 64, of the Shannon Heights section of Cedar Bluff, Virginia, passed away Sunday, February 20, 2005 in a Richlands, Virginia hospital following a lengthy illness. She was born in Richlands, Virginia and was the daughter of the late Charles H. and Pearl Preas Casey. She had made her home in the Richlands, Virginia area all of her life and was a retired teacher, volunteer coordinator, elementary supervisor, assistant principal, and principal for the Tazewell County School System having worked for over 36 years. She was a former Adjunct faculty member of SVCC. She was a Richlands High School Class of 1958 Graduate and received her B.S. in Education from Bluefield State College and her Masters in Education from Virginia Tech. She was a past president of the Virginia Association of Elementary School Principals and member of the VEA and NEA. She was a member of Delta Kappa Gamma. She was also a member of the Richlands Order of the Eastern Star Chapter #104.
