Lois Virginia Barnett, age 87 of Bandy, Virginia passed Thursday, January 12, 2012 in a Richlands, VA hospital. She was born in Tazewell County, VA and was the daughter of the late Charles Finley and Flora Ann Harrison McGuire. Ms. Barnett was a lifelong resident of the Bandy area. She was the Postmaster of the Bandy Post Office for 34 years. She helped start the Bandy Community Center where she was the Head Officer and member. She wrote the "Bandy News" section for several years for the Richlands News Press. She taught Sunday School at Tazewell Assembly of God for 30 years and Bandy Assembly of God for 10 years. In addition to her parents she was preceded in death by her husband, Woodrow W. Barnett, and one brother, Woodrow W. McGuire.
