Paul was a man of steady faith, a familiar face at St. Theresa's, and a friend to many. He was a man who knew the value of a hard day's work and the peace of a quiet home.

Paul is survived by his devoted wife, Della Sarver, and many dear friends. He was preceded in death by his parents and several siblings.

Per Paul's request, he was cremated, and the military will bury him at sea with the honors of the country he served.
