Mr. Stephen Randall Dye, Jr., age 27, of Pounding Mill, Virginia, died Monday, January 17, 2005 at a Kingsport, Tennessee hospital from injuries sustained in a vehicle accident in Kingsport. He was born in Richlands, Virginia and was a son of Stephen Randall Dye, Sr. of North Tazewell, Virginia and Mrs. Linda Ann Craft Dye of Richlands, Virginia. He was a lifelong resident of the Richlands area and was a 1995 graduate of Richlands High School where he excelled in all sports especially football and baseball. In 1999, he received his Bachelors of Education and Bachelors of Science Degree from Virginia Intermont College in Bristol, Virginia and was currently attending Radford University. Steve was a recreational therapist for the State of Virginia Marion Correctional Center in Marion, Virginia. He was preceded in death by his maternal grandparents, Ralph and Florence Craft.
