October 17, 1915 - October 22, 2004

Mr. Thurman M. "Pedro" Rose, age 89, of Richlands, Virginia, died Friday, October 22nd at a V.A. Care Center in Roanoke, Virginia following a lengthy illness. He was born in Cedar Bluff, Virginia and was a son of the late George Beverly and Eva Ocie Stephenson Rose, both Tazewell County natives. He made his home in the Richlands area most of his life, living in Michigan for several years, and was a retired employee of McClouth Steel in Detroit. He was a World War II U. S. Army Veteran, a member of the Casey-Shortt VFW Post #9640 of Richlands, Virginia and a member of the Richlands First Assembly of God Church.
