Troy Jesse Hankins, Jr. age 81 of Cedar Bluff, VA died Tuesday, October 25, 2011 at his home, surrounded by his loving family and friends. He was born April 15, 1930 in Baptist Valley, VA and was a son of the late Troy Jesse Hankins, Sr. and Mae Tabor Hankins.
